DID YOU KNOW?

The St. Scholastica Development committee was formed in 2017. In that time we've seriously considered several properties as prospective sites for a future parish location. Our parish boundaries are determined by the Archdiocese of Denver. Our borders extend from Arapahoe Road and Highway 7 to the south up to Oxford Road and Highway 119 to the north, and from Highway 287 to the west to Interstate 25 to the east, and include Boulder and Weld Counties. However, we're limiting our search for land to a smaller area within that rough square. Several factors come into play. First, we need to end up with the right address! We want newcomers and visitors to find us, and for that an Erie mailing address and zip code are best. New digital search methods pop up every day, but some can be finicky. Second, we want to be where the people are. St. Scholastica shouldn't be only a weekend destination! Many parishioners and visitors attend our daily masses and adoration, and we've long been juggling meeting spaces for our many groups and activities--one of the reasons we need a bigger church! Being close to the heart of Erie, by itself, means ruling out most Boulder County sites. Additionally, even less land is available there than in Weld County, and it comes at a higher cost. Interestingly, unimproved land that is further out from built up areas also may be pricier, since the developer (that would be us) usually ends up shouldering the costs of bringing out utilities. As you see, shopping for a future church site is very different from looking for residential or even business properties. You just don't find turnkey church properties in this area! That said, if you do hear of land available in the 5-10 acre range and up, let us know!


