DID YOU KNOW?

Would you be surprised to hear that Father Rob's dearest wish is to move our existing church once we acquire land for our future location?

That's right, his not-so-hidden agenda is to physically relocate our 120-year old church building! Why? It will of course be *impractical*—moving a large building is an incredibly complicated feat. Yet, that could actually be a very good thing, stretching us all to work together, learn interesting new things and pray very, very hard. Paradoxically, moving our church will also be *practical*—once the dust settles, we will have our church back again for the immediate future. Moving the building will provide *continuity*—preserving not only a significant historical structure but also the physical home of our sacramental heritage. At the same time the relocation will be *definitive*, marking a clear separation between St. Scholastica's sojourn at 615 Main Street and our future, to-be-determined address.

When the time comes, we'll find out how feasible this plan of moving our church is. It may turn out to be cost-prohibitive once we compare all the pros and cons. The route from Wells and Main to our unknown destination may present obstacles—power lines, bottlenecks, grades. If so, we'll adjust the plan. The underlying intent will be the same. We'll be entering a new chapter in our parish's history, but we'll also find a way to maintain a tangible, physical connection to our original structure.
