Pastor's Corner



The end is near! The end of the Liturgical year of course! November is a month that we typically come to the end of the liturgical year and thus the Cathoic Church focuses on the four last things: Heaven, Hell, Purgatory and Judgment.

962 "We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion, the merciful love of God and his saints is always [attentive] to our prayers" (Paul VI, CPG § 30).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church goes on to state:

954 The three states of the Church. "When the Lord comes in glory, and all his angels with him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to him. But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is' ":[(Lumen Gentium 49; cf. Mt 25:31; 1 Cor 15:26–27; Council of Florence (1439): DS 1305.]

There are special graces called indulgences that we receive when we do certain acts such as visiting a cemetery. Go visit your relatives in the cemetery and pray for them. Pray for those who are in a grave but have no grave marker. Pray for the poor souls in purgatory.

In our modern day and age there is this popular idea that everyone who dies goes to a better place. So many people that I have worked with who were contemplating sucicide believed this and just wanted to end their life because its better on the other side. DO NOT BELIEVE THIS HERESY! Those who choose to believe that all die and go to heaven or to their personal better place deny the Sacred Scriptures and all that Jesus mentioned about Hell. (Mt 21:35-46, Mt 5:22, 29; 10:28; 13:42, 50; Mk 9:43–48; Mt 25:41, just to name a few)

Be concerned with the salvation of souls, your own, your family members and your neighbors - it's what disciples have done for 2000 years! Pray, Fast, give Alms and as it is said in almost every Mass; "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, Holy Father, Almighty and Eternal God, through Christ our Lord. 




