# Pastor's Corner

You might have heard that I have a problem with allergies, Lymes disease, parasites, swollen ankles and a few other things. My doctor has been working for years on the Lymes disease and has said that being exposed to mold and allergens is making it easy for the lymes disease to thrive in me. He said and wrote a prescription that I have to get out of the mold environments. Since I became pastor, I have been making improvements to the rectory to make it a better place for me with my extreme sensitivities such as furniture, air purifiers, special mold inhibitors, carpets and more. Unfortunately, I still have reactions in the rectory. I also have reactions in the office and church, my life is such that I always

struggle with allergic reactions. I was asked by my brother priest, after my third trip to the emergency room to share my story with my superiors at the Archdiocese. So I did. They have a fund to help priests in difficult circumstances and after a review by their committee they granted me approval for the purchase of an RV. Part of the deal was that they would purchase the trailer and I would purchase the truck. So the Archdiocese purchased and titled the trailer; I purchased the truck from my retirement funds. The whole intent is for me to be able to heal from Lymes, control my allergen environment and to be flexible to attend priest convocations, retreats, conferences and other events. We looked into many different options from apartments, trailer homes, tiny homes, sheds and others but this one seemed to work the best and it has a place where I can have a small chapel inside. I am grateful to whomever established and has contributed to the fund at the Archdiocese because without it my ability to function as a priest would be severely limited. The parish has not funded the RV trailer or the truck, however it might be nice for us through the Finance Council to make a contribution to that fund to help other priests in difficult circumstances. We are looking into several options of a portable shed that we can use as an office but the Town of Erie has regulations that must be met. If you have any questions about the process or my health please ask me and please pray that this may truly be a means that God uses for my healing. May the peace of Christ fill your heart and your family with joy! Fr. Rob


