"It was late at night," he said. "I took a little nap on a curve right above Peaceful Valley. I woke up in just enough time to know I was in real trouble."

Willette went over a 100-foot cliff without a seat belt. The impact bounced him through the roof of his Cadillac El Dorado convertible. When he came to his senses, he was 30 feet from the car and wondering why he wasn't dead. A hospital took 30 x-rays, expecting to find broken bones or internal injuries. But except for some cuts and bruises, Willette was fine.

"I began to ask the question, 'my God, what if I'd died?"
"he said. "I began to think there must be more."

RETURNED TO PRIESTHOOD

He consulted a local priest about returning to the seminary. It took a year to sell off his property and business.
